Lately in conversation with friends or in pop culture, many have used the phrase "crossing the rainbow bridge." Maybe it is because of the success of Marvel movies, or maybe it is a way to acknowledge difficult truths like death or spiritual realities in softer tones that are easier to handle. Either way, it leads me to ask: How do we handle difficult questions about life? Are we prepared to give the reasons for our Hope? Are we prepared as ALL-IN followers of Jesus to lead others to Christ?

Challenged and inspired by these questions and aided by the Navigators Bridge, which has invited many to consider the bridge to life through Holy Scripture, we will consider these questions in a **7-week sermon series beginning April 14**. We will be invited to ask questions, reflect upon and memorize Scripture, and be equipped to share what we have learned with a world who, like us, so desperately needs the Jesus-shaped path He leads us on. **Listed below are some of the verses to reflect upon and memorize**.

Let's get prepared. We need Jesus. The world needs Jesus. Let's invite others on this path!

What Next?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ;

Many of you were able to participate in the forum which discussed Eric Metaxas' book, "Letter to the American Church." I advertised this forum before it began as "provocative," and if you've read the book or discussed its topics with others, I'm sure you now agree.

If you haven't had a chance to encounter Mr. Metaxas' work, I urge you to do so. He challenges the people of every congregation, and perhaps especially today's pastors, to engage with the world's prevailing narratives. In fact, and most provocative, he compares the modern American church's lack of public voice to the way in which the German churches and their pastors were quiet and trusting as the Nazis rose to power in the early 1930s. It turned out that Dietrich Bonhoeffer, accompanied by relatively few others, and the few contrary voices were extinguished – Bonhoeffer himself was executed after a long imprisonment just before Hitler would end his own life.

Are we really living in a historical period which has the same dynamics as Nazi Germany? Are people under threat of their lives if they speak in ways which are contrary to the prevailing American thought and speech narrative? If we speak out as Christians today, might we be "cancelled" as Bonhoeffer was when he spoke on the German radio stations in March of 1933? (His broadcast to the nation one month after Hitler assumed power was pulled from the airwaves under mysterious circumstances about 20 minutes after it began.)

As our forum considered these things and much more, as you can imagine, we didn't all agree on many (perhaps none) of the points Mr. Metaxas made in his book. But thanks be to God, we did all listen to one another, and I think some of those thoughts raised from among the group instructed us all in new ways of thinking. We recognized from the Bonhoeffer example (and that of the ancient prophets) that it is often the minority voice which carries God's most important messages.

So, the forum is now over, Easter has almost passed, and the question arises from the forum group, "What next?" What form should our mutual conversation, and perhaps our actions, take in the near future?

Well, first I'll recover from knee replacement surgery. But while I'm recovering during the month of April, I'll be wrestling and planning with the questions above.

To that end, I asked those who participated in the "Letter" forum to suggest topics for future discussion. The suggestions I've received already could keep us busy for many, many months. A quick sample of topics include (in no particular order): abortion, human trafficking, transgender issues, biblical citizenship, nurturing the rising generation, and adjusting worship content and format to better include such topics. That's quite a list, and I assure you, I have been graced with many more topics as well.


