Dear Friends,

In the summer of 1980, my family lived in a small apartment on the corner of a busy intersection of a south Seattle community. It was no small endeavor for a nine-year-old to traverse the six lanes of traffic by foot or by bicycle, but adventure awaited. Crossing that street was scary, and as I think back on it as an adult now, there were more dangers than I was even aware of then. When I traveled that road with others it was much easier than when I went alone.

So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. Isaiah 41:10

What is Hope?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

All right then, the Lord himself will give you the sign. Look! The virgin will concieve a child! She will give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel (which means God is with us) -Isaiah 7:14

Let's consider three questions as we enter into the Advent season:

What is hope?

What is the difference between hope and optimism?

Throughout the Old Testament, God promised a Savior, but few expected our savior to be incarnated as a helpless baby in a dirty stable. What role did hope play in the lives of Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the wise men as Jesus came into the world?

As we consider these questions, I encourage you to read through the following Bible verses:

For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: wonderful counselor, mighty God, everlasting father, prince of peace. His government and its peace will never end. He will rule with fairness and justice from the throne of his ancestor David for all eternity. The passionate commitment of the Lord of Heaven's armies will make this happen! -Isaiah 9:6-7

In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a village in Galilee, to a virgin named Mary. She was engaged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of King David. Gabriel appeared to her and said, "Greetings, favored woman! The Lord is with you!" Confused and disturbed, Mary tried to think what the angel could mean. "Don't be afraid, Mary," the angel told her, "for you have found favor with God! You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be very great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David. And he will reign over Israel forever; his Kingdom will never end!" -Luke 1:26-33

Mary asked the angel, "But how can this happen? I am a virgin." The angel replied, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the baby to be born will be holy, and he will be called the Son of God. What's more, your relative Elizabeth has become pregnant in her old age! People used to say she was barren, but she has conceived a son and is now in her sixth month. For the word of God will never fail." Mary responded, "I am the Lord's servant. May everything you have said about me come true." And then the angel left her. -Luke 1:34-38





This month the Council had several items of new business to discuss. Among them, the election results were certified and approved and bus repairs discussed. 


