Dear Friends,



These Holy Days return our focus, renew our faith, and reassert our daily vocation to follow.



Our Lenten Journey

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ;

February 13th will be Fat Tuesday, the climactic day of the Mardi Gras celebration on the U.S. Gulf Coast. All over the Christian world similar celebrations will be held as people eat their fill of traditional pastries. The urge is to be filled up because Lent starts the next day. Lent is a time to give things up and tradition says that most of us will give up food – for example: we don't eat meat, or we stop eating sweets. We don't know why we do these things ... we do them because we always have. The focus is on us. We have to fill ourselves because we are about to decide what we will give up for forty days. But we are wrong. The cycle of our lives we call Lent has little to do with our selves. It has almost nothing to do with what we put into our selves or what we don't put in. Lent is a time to focus on the One much greater than any of us.

This is the time when we put aside our thanksgiving and praise of God just enough, so that we can ask ourselves, "What if there were no God?" or "What if Christ did not come to ransom me from sin?" If somehow, miraculously, you came to be without the existence of God, what could you make of yourself? Answer: When your time on this earth is finished, you would become dust. That would be the end. No accomplishments you have ever produced, no amount of money you have accumulated, no number of family members who have sprung from your lineage would matter a bit. You would be dust. And the same would be true for all your accomplishments, your money, and even your family – eventually. Were there to be no God, or if God ever chose to give up on us, life would not matter. Hope, the human emotion which sustains us through the trials of life, would be a cosmic joke.

We need God in order to understand that life has any meaning whatsoever. But God doesn't need us at all. After all, if there were no people in creation, God could raise up new people from stones.

Fortunately, you are not the product of a cosmic accident. From less than ashes or dust, from out of nothing, God formed creation. Genesis tells us that God scooped up the dust of the ground and breathed life into it. As a result, we have been created by the grace of God. Yes, we have come from the dust. Yes, as our physical bodies age they shall once again be reduced to nothingness. We shall become dust once again. But today, brothers and sisters, we live lives of value. We live because by the grace of God, dust has been formed into God's image ... and we are the result.

We are children of earth, created from the dust, yet filled with the breath of God. As February 14th, Ash Wednesday, approaches this year, we face our mortality once again and we face the limits of our existence on this earth. Ashes will be smeared on our forehead as we hear the same words spoken first by God to Adam and Eve following their disobedience: "You are dust and to dust you shall return." These words remind us of similar words we've heard when we have buried our loved ones: Earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust.

The imposition of ashes serves as a personal warning that we will not live forever. The dusty mark of the cross is a humbling reminder of our limits as human beings. But I invite you to look beyond the dirt. The mark of the cross will be renewed on your foreheads on Ash Wednesday – the same mark of the cross made once before in your life with clean, clear water – the mark that sealed you with the cross of Christ at the time of your baptism. The mark of the cross you receive on Ash Wednesday is an invitation to go on a profound spiritual journey that will lead you from the dust, to the waters of rebirth, to dust again, and then on to a new life of resurrection. Our Lenten pilgrimage will retrace the steps of our Lord and Savior – a trip to the cross, a body fit only for burial in the ground, and a lifting up of that body to God's glory.

God doesn't need us, but still chose to die for us in order to eternally save us. There is no greater love than one who willingly gives his life for another. God did this even though God has no need of us. This is evidence of love beyond bounds. This is why our Lenten challenge ought not to be "what shall I give up" but rather "what if God gave up on me?" God does not give up on humanity, and that is why we are invited during the forty days of Lent to turn away from our natural focus on our selves and to turn attention toward God instead ... especially toward the precious gift of hope given to us in our baptisms.

May your Lenten journey take you to a deeper understanding of your baptism and a closer walk with Jesus Christ in your life. As we journey together, may we all find the true treasure gifted to us by God – not the things of this life which shall surely become dust, but the One who lives forever, the One who gave us the promise of resurrection, Jesus Christ our Lord.

January 2024 Council Meeting Summary




