Therefore, the vision of the Body of Christ we see in Christ is reflected in the three-fold vision is affirmed when remember that, "Faith is home where we walk a path living a Jesus-shaped path with God. each other, and the people we encounter."

As Christ the head of the church is ALL IN for us by sacrificing Himself for us, He calls us to be ALL IN with sacrificial love for God, each other, and the people we encounter who desperately need the Gospel. I am praying we will be united on this path together. How is the Lord leading you to be fully devoted to following Jesus in this three-fold cord? The gift of this kind of mystic union like marriage isn't always easy, but it is beautiful. His will be done, His Kingdom come.

The Church's Annual Journey

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ;

Advent is marked by a spirit of expectation, anticipation, preparation, and longing. We yearn for deliverance from the evils of the world, first expressed by Israelite slaves in Egypt as they cried out from their bitter oppression. It is the cry of those who have experienced injustice in a world under the curse of sin, and yet who have hope of deliverance by a God who has heard the cries of oppressed slaves and brought deliverance!

It is that hope, however faint at times, and that God, however distant He sometimes seems, which brings to the world the anticipation of a King who will rule with truth and justice and righteousness over His people and in His creation. It is that hope that once anticipated, and now anticipates again, the reign of an Anointed One, a Messiah, who will bring peace, justice, and righteousness to this world.

Part of our expectation also anticipates a judgment on sin and a calling of the world to accountability before God. We long for God to come and set the world right! Yet, as the prophet Amos warned, the expectation of a coming judgment may not be the day of light that we want, because the penetrating light of God's judgment of sinfulness will shine just as brightly on God's people.

Because of this important truth, Advent has come to be celebrated more in terms of expectation or anticipation. Yet, the anticipation of the coming of the Messiah throughout the Old Testament was not in connection with remembrance of sins. Instead, the Messiah's coming was expected in the context of oppression and injustice, the longing for redemption, not from personal guilt and sin but from the evil of the world made known in evil empires and tyrants. It is in that sense that all creation groans for its deliverance as we witness the evil that dominates our world (Rom 8:18-25).

Of course, there is the problem of wanting relief from an evil world when we are contributors to that evil. This is the power of Amos' images when he warns about longing for the "Day of the Lord" that will really be a day of darkness (Amos 5:18-20). Still, even with Amos' warning the time of Advent is one of expectation and anticipation, a longing for God's actions to restore all things and vindicate the righteous. So, while some church traditions focus on penitence during Advent, the spirit of expectation from the Old Testament is better captured with a joyous sense of anticipation. Rather than a time of mourning and fasting, Advent is celebrated as a time of joy and happiness as we await the coming of the King.

There will be time during the rest of the journey through the Church Year to remember our sins. We begin in Epiphany when we hear about the intended fellowship of God's Kingdom, and realize our failure to produce it. Then as we move toward and through Lent, we realize that the coming of Jesus served more to lay bare our own sin than it did to vindicate our personal righteousness. There will be time to shed Peter's bitter tears as we realize that what started with such possibility and expectation has apparently ended in such failure.

It is only as we experience that full cycle, beginning with joy in Advent, that slowly fades into the realization of what we have done with and to the Christ, that the awful reality of Good Friday can have its full impact. And in that realization we can finally be ready to hear the Good News on Resurrection Sunday! That is the journey that the disciples took. There is value for each of us to take this annual journey beginning with the anticipation and joy of Advent!

The spirit of Advent is well told in the parable of the bridesmaids who are anxiously awaiting the coming of the Bridegroom (Matt 25:1-13). There is profound joy at the Bridegroom's expected coming. And yet a warning of the need for preparation echoes through the parable. But even then, the prayer of Advent is still:

Come, O Come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel!

(At Faith, Advent will begin with our worship on November 25th and 26th.)

May the peace of the soon-to-be-born Messiah be with you, **Pr. Mark**, **Behenna**,






