

## **Two Things**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This month I am writing to you concerning two subjects, one a bit heavy and one quite hopeful.

#### **Thing One**

I apologize to you, all of you. Back in our March newsletter, I made a case that political speech has no place in the pulpit. I also said that it is impermissible for a pastor to stand before the congregation and advise the members how to vote. With regard to voting, my thoughts about the pastor's role have not changed. However, I have learned more recently (it's more accurate to say that I've been convicted in the past month) when it comes to proclaiming God's Word in the face of secular political activities.

My change of heart came about when one of our brothers gifted me a book entitled "Letter to the American Church," by Eric Metaxas. You may be familiar with Mr. Metaxas' earlier biographical works on Martin Luther and Dietrich Bonhoeffer. In his "Letter," Metaxas draws on his Bonhoeffer research into the actions and inactions of the German church as Nazism was on the rise in 1930's Germany. The first persons to be persecuted and eliminated from that society were not the Jews, but surprising to many of us these 90 years later, it was those with birth defects or other crippling infirmities. Later, Hitler's scourge grew to afflict Gypsies, Jews, and Russians. Millions died. The majority of the German Church held on to Luther's 400-year-old view that governmental leaders were to be honored as representative of God's intent for His people, and thus they did nothing through it all. Evil was met with the Church's silence.

The exception to the German Church's failing was a relatively small group which came to be known as the "Confessing Church," of which Bonhoeffer was a principal spiritual leader. Bonhoeffer trusted the Lord to such an extent that he spoke to his whole nation on a radio broadcast to let everyone know that what the Nazi regime was up to was contrary to God's will. Governmental authorities "pulled the plug" on that broadcast before it was finished. And yes, a few years later, as you likely know, Pr. Bonhoeffer paid the ultimate price for his opposition to the evil authority of his time.

Please do not take what is described above as a call "to die" on behalf of our Lord's calling. Instead, Metaxas teaches us that trusting Christ to lead us when evil rises up in the world is an essential part of our Christian calling. Dr. Martin Luther King and many others lived out this reality too. Martin Luther himself also lived through extremely adverse political threats (which causes us to carefully balance his later advice to honor the authorities appointed over us).

Should evil arise in our modern political environment or in our cultural or social spheres, it is the pastor's responsibility and calling to point to and oppose that evil. Again, this is different than supporting a specific political candidate.

A church which remains silent in the face of evil is not a church at all. To be silent when evil is afoot is to condone that evil. I repent, and going forward I shall summon the guidance of God's Holy Spirit whenever the time calls for me to voice opposition to evil among us.

God, give me the strength and wisdom to trust you to give me the words and actions that uphold your will.

#### **Thing Two**

In the August issue of "Faith Alive" I described a field of ancient wheat, called "Khorasan," which has been planted in a field in Corrales, New Mexico. I've been privileged to have been allowed to help tend this wheat crop since its planting. Today I can report that a good number of wheat plants have grown to a point where the wheat heads themselves are gloriously visible (see picture). Some sections of the field have not offered a good yield, and other portions did not support any yield at all. This reminds me of Jesus' parable about the farmer whose seed fell on various kinds of soil. Nonetheless, I'm heartened to witness God's bounty rising from the earth.





Now she's earning enough to keep her family afloat, and she's even training other women how to produce and sell honey.

Dear Friends,

Thank you for your gift of \$500 to Roadrunner Food Bank. Your generosity and support help **Roadrunner Food Bank** continue to put much needed food on the tables of New Mexicans facing hunger in communities across our state.

This is an important time of year for Roadrunner Food Bank, as we work with schools to provide food to families in a variety of ways through our Childhood Hunger Initiative (CHI). CHI works to solve child and family hunger by providing each partner school the ability to receive food from Roadrunner through a combination of hunger-relief programs. School Pantries provide each school the opportunity to create a school-based or on-site food pantry allowing families to receive help anytime it is needed during the school year. Mobile Pantries, where every month schools receive a monthly mobile or "traveling" food such as vegetables, fruit, dairy, meat, and much more. Backpacks, where a small amount of food can be sent home in a backpack with the child to help the family through a short amount of time. This supplements food for children and families in situations where a parent/guardian is unable to pick up food from school.

Once again, thank you for being a crucial part of ensuring that our neighbors facing hunger have access to fresh produce and other essential nutritious food.
